 - Participants will be allowed to compete in one (1) STAR Event (pre-qualified from Districts) and one (1) IDAHO Event.

5. Voting Delegates:

- **Please be watching for ballot and voting information** on our Idaho FCCLA website. Additional information to come.
- Voting delegates will be registered in the conference registration system.
- You are allowed only one voting delegate unless you have more than 49 members.
- Delegates should not be a STAR or IDAHO Events competitor.
- You may substitute another registered member for the voting delegate that attended the Voting Delegate Meeting.
- Check the Conference Schedule for Voting Delegate Meeting times and dates.
- Attendance is required at all Voting Delegate Meetings.
- Chapters can have voting delegates as per number of registered chapter members below.



Major Changes in the 2022-2023 Competitive Event Guidelines

The following is a listing of the <u>major</u> changes in the 2022-2023 Competitive Events Guides. It is in no way inclusive and participants and advisers should continue to **read the event rules carefully** to ensure eligibility and successful event completion and presentation.

The Competitive Events Guide has now been divided into four different documents. The documents are available to members and advisers through the FCCLA Adviser and Student Portals under the "Resources" tab.

-FCCLA Knowledge Matters Virtual Business Challenge Simulation Guidelines
-FCCLA/LifeSmarts Knowledge Bowl Guidelines
-Skill Demonstration Events Guidelines
-STAR Events Guidelines

These resources, provided for members and developed with funds from membership dues, are available to advisers and members through the FCCLA Adviser and Student Portals. The Competitive Events Guides will only be available to affiliated chapters and members beginning November 1.

STAR Events

The following events have been updated to reflect changes per level (scaffolding) as submitted by state associations. These events have multiple revisions in addition to updated rubrics. Please be sure that members understand their level of competition (1, 2, 3 or 4). They are:

- Chapter in Review Display
- Chapter in Review Portfolio
- Chapter Service Project Display
- Chapter Service Project Portfolio
- Interpersonal Communications
- Digital Stories for Change
- FCCLA Chapter Website

- Instructional Video Design

- Parliamentary Procedure
- Promote and Publicize FCCLA
- Teach or Train
- **Dress Code** Professional attire is no longer permitted. The FCCLA official code or costumes/chefs' attire (when applicable) are only acceptable.
- **FCCLA Planning Process** Rubrics have been updated to reflect the Planning Process being worth 10 points compared to the previous 5 points (when applicable).
- **Leadership** To add more substance to the Leadership STAR Event, a book component has now been added. A rotating list of suggested leadership books is available on the FCCLA Portal.
- **Point Summary Form** The following point adjustments have been made.
 - Registration Packet 1 point (previously 3 points)
 - Event Online Orientation 1 point (previously 2 points)
- Name Changes The following events had minor name changes.
 - Teach and Train is now Teach or Train
 - This event has always specified that members either choose to teach or train, they do not do both.
 - Regional, state and national competitions should **not** dock points if a competitor accidently puts "Teach and Train" on their project.
 - o Promote and Publicize FCCLA! Is now Promote and Publicize FCCLA
 - We removed the (!) as there was no official reason to need it.
- Online Orientation Form The Online Orientation Form no longer needs to be printed and signed. National Staff will pull a
 report after the June 15 deadline and automatically add those points to the Point Summary Form. Competitors will no longer
 need to show evidence to the room consultant or include it in their portfolio. Note: The Online Project Summary form is still
 required to be printed.

Competitive Events—STAR Events

Students Taking Action with Recognition (STAR) Events are conducted according to the FCCLA National STAR Events Manual found in the National FCCLA website Chapter Portal.

- The District STAR Events Coordinator will submit the STAR Events district results via the DLG to the State STAR Events coordinator within three (3) days of completion of the district competition. The top two (2) finishers in each event/category that meet the minimum score requirement will be eligible to compete at the state leadership conference. After all districts have submitted their results additional at large qualifiers will be notified. All forms, registration, and affiliation will be verified by the Idaho STAR Events Coordinator.
- 2. STAR Events will be held during the State Leadership Conference on Thursday April 6, 2023.
 - Baking & Pastry will be held at the Renaissance Culinary Center: 1307 E. Central Dr. Meridian, ID
 - Culinary Arts will be held at Mountain View High School: 2000 S Millennium Way, Meridian, ID
 - All other competitive events will be held at JUMP in Boise. In case of overflow some events may take place on Friday April 7th. Affected competitors will be notified prior to SLC.
- 3. Participation at the State level requires STAR Event competitors to do the following:
 - a. Be an affiliated member by February 1, 2023.
 - b. Pay a non-refundable \$15 STAR Event registration fee in addition to delegate registration.
 - c. Watch the online orientation video prior to State Leadership Conference and submit the proof of completion form to the room consultant at the time of competition. Failure to do so will re-sult in point deduction.
 - d. Complete the online project summary form in the National FCCLA portal (found under survey applications and competitive events) prior to competition. A copy of the proof of online project summary form submission should be given to the room consultant at the time of competition. Failure to do so will result in point deduction.
 - e. Be on time for competitions; be courteous to other competitors, judges, and room consultants.
 - f. The FCCLA official dress code or costumes/chef's attire (when applicable) are only acceptable.
- 4. Attend the Friday afternoon Recognition Ceremony and sit by event/category. Must be wearing official dress and conference name tag to walk across the stage.
- 5. The top two (2) finishers in each event/category that meet the minimum score requirement will be eligible to compete at National Leadership Conference. The top three (3) finishers in Baking and Pastry and Culinary Arts will be eligible to compete at National Leadership Conference in Denver, CO.
- 6. National Qualifiers must confirm or decline competing at NLC by noon (MST) on April 15, 2023 using the National Qualifier form found in the FCCLA Portal and Idaho FCCLA website.

Competitive Events—IDAHO Events

- 1. Any member affiliated by March 1, 2023 is eligible to compete in one (1) STAR Event and one (1) IDAHO Event. See the Idaho FCCLA website for the <u>IDAHO Events Guide</u>
- 2. Pay a non-refundable \$10 IDAHO Event registration fee in addition to delegate registration.
- 3. Competitors must watch the online orientation video prior to State Leadership conference. and submit the proof of completion form to the room consultant at the time of competition. Failure to do so will result in a point deduction.
- 4. IDAHO Events are **not** STAR Events and will not advance to the national level, except National Spotlight on Projects. The top two in this category will represent Idaho in the Spotlight on National Projects at the National Leadership Conference.
- 5. Idaho Events will be held on Friday April 7, at JUMP in Boise. In case of overflow some events may take place on Thursday April 6. Affected competitors will be notified prior to SLC.
- 4. Attend the Friday afternoon Recognition Ceremony and sit by event/category. Must be wearing official dress and conference name tag to walk across the stage.

Awards and Recognitions

Awards will be given to chapters making noteworthy accomplishments. For chapters wishing to apply for the awards or to nominate individuals for recognition, use these forms:

- 1. Honorary Membership Nomination Individual / Honorary Membership Nomination Organization: Individual adult or organization who has contributed at chapter, district and state levels in an extraordinary manner
- 2. Outstanding Adviser Nomination: For adviser's service to the association, chapter, and district for four (4) or more years
- 3. Inspirational New Adviser Nomination: For adviser's service of one (1) to three (3) years
- 4. New Professional Nomination: For a first-year teacher/adviser or student teacher
- 5. Outstanding/Exemplary Chapter Award: To recognize outstanding chapters for specific activities.
- 6. National Adult awards found in the chapter portal.

Dress Code

•Mandatory* Attire for General Sessions/ Business Session/ Workshops/ STAR Events/ Recognition

- •FCCLA Red Blazer.
- •Professional white or black shirt.
- •Neckwear options: can include the neckwear from the official emblematic supplier, black or red tie or bow tie, single strand of pearls, red, black, and/or white scarf. or no neckwear.
- •Black slacks, skirt, or sheath dress.
- •Shoes (black preferred).

*Exception: Culinary Arts and Baking and Pastry Event participants are welcome to wear their chef's attire during the STAR Events Recognition Session.

Advisers/ Chaperones/ Guests:

- Business professional attire.
- Jeans, t-shirts, or athletic wear are NOT acceptable.

STAR Event and IDAHO Event Participants:

STAR Events participants are expected to adhere to the published dress code. For participation in competition, follow event specifications for dress, and wear appropriate clothing for the nature of the presentation. If attending conference activities prior to or immediately after a presentation, be prepared to change into clothing that meets the conference dress code.

Closing Ceremony Banquet Attendees:

- Semi-formal or business professional attire
- Jeans, t-shirts, athletic wear, and athletic shoes are NOT acceptable

Unacceptable Attire:

- Skin-tight, revealing, or midriff-baring clothing
- Extremely short skirts (shorter than 2 inches above the knee)
- Clothing with suggestive or obscene printing or promotes illegal substances and/or activities
- Swimwear, rubber beach-type flip flops
- Nightwear (pajamas) should not be worn outside of your hotel room
- Leggings are not considered pants
- Athletic clothing including hats and athletic shoes
