

Competitive Event Information



STAR Events begin at 8:30 a.m. on Thursday, April 6.

- STAR Event competition times will be posted on the wall outside of the JUMP room on the fifth floor after the opening session on Wednesday evening.
- Advisers will be able to view competition times in the registration system on Wednesday evening.
- Baking and Pastry will begin 8:30 a.m. on April 6 at Renaissance High School.
- Culinary Arts will begin at 9 a.m. at Mountain View High School.
- Advisers will be contacted with competition times and shuttle information.

Idaho Events will be held from 8 a.m. to noon on Friday, April 7.

- Idaho Event competition times will be posted outside of the MOVE studio on the fifth floor on Thursday evening.
- Advisers will be able to view competition times for Idaho Events in the registration system on Thursday evening.
- Cupcake Decorating and Culinary Knife Skills will be held in the Share Studio on the first floor.



- With 32 different STAR Events and 13 Idaho Events, it's crucial that you know your event guidelines. Take the time NOW to make sure your project meets all the national or state requirements for your event.
- Use the QR code to print and sign the Competitive Events Online Orientation form and give it to your room consultant on the day you compete. It's worth a point, so don't forget it!
- All competitors must adhere to the published conference dress code for all general sessions, workshops, and the Competitive Events Recognition Session. However, Culinary Arts and Baking and Pastry participants may wear their chef's attire to the recognition session.
- On the day of your competition, follow your event specifications for dress, and wear appropriate clothing for the nature of the presentation.
- If you're attending conference activities before or immediately after competing in an event, be prepared to change into clothing that meets the conference dress code.



WHEN YOU

COMPETE

- Competitors should be at their event location at least 30 minutes before their scheduled time. Competitors more than 15 minutes late may be disqualified.
- When it's your turn, a room consultant will call for your team and direct you to the event station.
 - Only participants may enter the competition area; your supporters will be asked to wait for you outside of the competition area.
- If you have a portfolio or file folder, please present this to the room consultant at this time.
- You are responsible for carrying in and setting up all of your own materials.
 - FCCLA does not provide access to an electrical outlet, so if you're using anything electronic, you'll need to make sure it's allowed in your event, and that it's fully charged.
 - No wall space, additional tables, or supplies beyond what is outlined in your event guidelines are available.
- Unless your event specifically allows for it, you are prohibited from providing materials or handouts during your presentation.
- You'll be introduced by room consultants to the evaluators, and they'll signal when to begin your presentation.
- During your presentation, you may see a timer hold up a 5-minute, 1-minute, or stop card. All presentations will be stopped at the maximum time limit.
- Following your presentation, evaluators will have a short amount of time to interview you, ask additional questions, or review any of your materials to complete their scoring. You may be asked to step away from your presentation materials during this time.
- At the end of your competition time, be sure to take ALL of your materials with you.
