Applications and Forms

- Online forms and applications are available on the Idaho FCCLA website. Available forms include State Officer Applications, Chapter and Adviser Awards, Plaque Order, and more.

Competitive Events

- Competitive Event testing will be completed online prior to SLC.
- Participants will be given a code and a testing window to complete testing. Participants must be registered for SLC to receive testing codes. Information will be sent after registration close.
- Participants may compete in one STAR Event (pre-qualified from Districts) and one Idaho Event.
- Students may additionally compete in one online STAR Event or Parliamentary Procedure.

Voting Delegates

- Ballot and voting information will be available on the Idaho FCCLA website.
- Voting delegates must be registered in the conference registration system.
- Attendance is required at all Voting Delegate Meetings. Chapters may substitute another person for the registered delegate at the meeting if necessary.
- Chapters may only register one voting delegate, unless the chapter has more than 49 members, receiving another delegate per 50 members.

Chapter Roll Call

Registration

1. Regular registration opens January 12 and is due by February 13
 - Online orientation will be available - Watch for the link coming soon!

 - Changes can only be made to online registration until February 20
2. Payment: due by March 5 to avoid a late payment fee.

 - Payment postmarked by February 27 to ensure your payment arrives on time.
 - Payment can also be made online for a 2.5% fee at [Access Idaho](#).
 - Additional late fees will be assessed if full registration payment is not received in advance or at the registration table on Wednesday.
 - There will be a 5% late fee added to all past due registration payments.
3. Late registration: due by February 20
 - Contact fccla@cte.idaho.gov for late registration requests.
 - Additional late fees will be assessed. Refer to the Fee Schedule for late registration costs.
4. Cancellation/refunds: due by February 24
 - All cancellations must be submitted in writing and emailed to fccla@cte.idaho.gov no later than February 24 by 5:00 pm (MST) to be eligible for a 50% refund.
 - Telephone cancellations will not be accepted.
 - Regrettably, Idaho FCCLA cannot honor refund requests after February 24.

Say Yes to FCS Signing Day—Friday, March 13

Idaho FCCLA will have the Signing Day Event for future FCS professionals at the 2025 State Leadership Conference during closing sessions on Friday.

FCCLA members going on to college in an FCS major will be celebrated. Members will sign letters of intent to the University of Idaho, Idaho State University, BYU-Idaho, and other colleges with FCS related content. Each future FCS college student will receive university swag.

Start the conversation with the graduating seniors in your FCS classes. Attending SLC will mean meeting university staff and being highlighted for their choice to attend a post-secondary school institution and major in FCS.

Closing Ceremony Banquet—Friday, March 13

Join us to say goodbye to the outgoing State Executive Council and meet the new team. There will be a limited number of tickets available, the price of which will be determined on a later date. Tickets will be purchaseable in the online registration system as an add-on for those wishing to attend.

Dress Code

Mandatory Attire for ALL General Sessions:

- FCCLA Red Blazer.
- Professional white or black shirt.
- Neckwear options: can include the neckwear from the official emblematic supplier, black or red tie or bow tie, single strand of pearls, red, black, and/or white scarf, or no neckwear.
- Black slacks, skirt, or sheath dress.
- Shoes (black preferred).

*Exception: Culinary Arts and Baking and Pastry Event participants are welcome to wear their Chef's attire during the STAR Events Recognition Session.



Advisers/ Chaperones/ Guests:

- Business professional attire.
- Jeans, t-shirts, or athletic wear are NOT acceptable.

STAR Event and Idaho Event Participants:

STAR Events participants are expected to adhere to the published dress code. For participation in competition, follow event specifications for dress, and wear appropriate clothing for the nature of the presentation. If attending conference activities prior to or immediately after a presentation, be prepared to change into clothing that meets the conference dress code.

Closing Ceremony Banquet Attendees:

- Semi-formal or business professional attire.
- Jeans, t-shirts, athletic wear, and athletic shoes are NOT acceptable.

Unacceptable Attire:

- Skin-tight, revealing, or midriff-baring clothing.
- Extremely short skirts (shorter than 2 inches above the knee).
- Clothing with suggestive or obscene printing or promotes illegal substances and/or activities.
- Swimwear, rubber beach-type flip flops.
- Nightwear (pajamas) should not be worn outside of your hotel room.
- Leggings are not considered pants.
- Athletic clothing including hats and athletic shoes.

STAR Events

Students Taking Action with Recognition (STAR) Events are conducted according to the FCCLA National STAR Events Manual found in the National FCCLA website Chapter Portal.

The District STAR Events Coordinator will submit the STAR Events district results via the DLG to the State STAR Events coordinator within three (3) days of completion of the district competition. The top two (2) finishers in each event/category that meet the minimum score requirement will be eligible to compete at the State Leadership Conference. After all districts have submitted their results additional at large qualifiers will be notified. All forms, registration, and affiliation will be verified by the Idaho Competitive Events Coordinator.

STAR Events will be held during the State Leadership Conference on Thursday, March 12, 2026.

- Baking & Pastry will be held at the Renaissance Culinary Center: 1307 E. Central Dr. Meridian, ID
- Culinary Arts will be held at Mountain View High School: 2000 S. Millennium Way, Meridian, ID
- All other competitive events will be held at JUMP in Boise.
- In case of overflow some events may take place on Friday, March 13. Affected competitors will be notified prior to SLC.

Participation at the State level requires STAR Event competitors to do the following:

- Be an affiliated member by January 5, 2026.
- Pay a non-refundable \$15 STAR Event registration fee in addition to delegate registration.
- For Baking & Pastry and Culinary competitor, pay a non-refundable \$15 Food fee in addition to STAR Event registration.
- Watch the online orientation video prior to State Leadership Conference and verify completion at registration.
- Complete the Online Project Summary form in the National FCCLA portal (found under survey applications and competitive events) prior to competition. A copy of the proof of online project summary form submission should be given to the room consultant at the time of competition. Failure to do so will result in point deduction.
- Be on time for competitions; be courteous to other competitors, judges, and room consultants.
- The FCCLA official dress code or chef attire (when applicable) are only acceptable.
- Attend the Friday afternoon Recognition Ceremony and sit by event/category. Must be wearing official dress code and conference name tag to walk across the stage. Baking & Pastry and Culinary competitors are permitted to wear chef attire.

The top two (2) finishers in each event/category that meet the minimum score requirement will be eligible to compete at National Leadership Conference. The top three (3) finishers in Baking and Pastry and Culinary Arts, Job Interview, Leadership, Say Yes to FCS Education, Sustainability Challenge, and Teach or Train will be eligible to take the test to compete at National Leadership Conference.

National Qualifiers must confirm or decline competing at NLC by noon (MST) on March 20, 2026 using the National Qualifier form found in the FCCLA Portal and Idaho FCCLA website.

No-Show Fee of \$10 per competitor will be billed directly to the chapter after the conference.

Idaho Events

1. Any member affiliated by February 6, 2026 is eligible to compete in one (1) STAR Event and one (1) Idaho Event.
2. Pay a non-refundable \$15 Idaho Event registration fee in addition to delegate registration.
3. No-Show Fee of \$10 per competitor will be billed directly to the chapter after the conference.
4. Competitors must watch the online orientation video prior to State Leadership Conference and verify at registration. Failure to do so will result in a point deduction.
5. Be on time for competitions; be courteous to other competitors, judges, and room consultants.
6. Idaho Events will be held on Friday, March 13, at JUMP in Boise. In case of overflow some events may take place on Thursday, March 12. Affected competitors will be notified prior to SLC.
7. Attend the Friday afternoon Recognition Ceremony and sit by event/category. Must be wearing official dress and conference name tag to walk across the stage.
