Major Changes in the 2023-2024 Competitive Event Guidelines

The following is a listing of the <u>major</u> changes in the 2023-2024 Competitive Events Guides. It is in no way inclusive and participants and advisers should continue to **read the event rules carefully** to ensure eligibility and successful event completion and presentation.

Special Note: This year, the guidelines underwent a comprehensive audit conducted by CEAT and the National FCCLA Staff in order to align the specifications with the rubrics. Nearly all the wording in the rubrics and specifications has been revised for improved grammar, clarification, and other enhancements.

The Competitive Events Guide is divided into five different documents. The documents are available to members and advisers through the FCCLA Adviser and Student Portals under the "Resources" tab

- -FCCLA Knowledge Matters Virtual Business Challenge Simulation Guidelines
- -FCCLA/LifeSmarts Knowledge Bowl Guidelines
- -Skill Demonstration Events Guidelines
- Online Challenge Testing (previously with Skill Demonstration Events)
- -STAR Events Guidelines

These resources, provided for members and developed with funds from membership dues, are available to advisers and members through the FCCLA Adviser and Student Portals. The Competitive Events Guides will only be available to affiliated chapters and members beginning November 1.

STAR Events

The following events have been updated to reflect changes per level (scaffolding) as submitted by state associations. These events have multiple revisions in addition to updated rubrics. Please be sure that members understand their level of competition (1, 2, 3 or 4). They are:

- Early Childhood Education (Levels 2 4)
- Fashion Construction (Levels 1 4)
- Fashion Design (Levels 2 4)
- Focus on Children (Levels 1 4)
- Hospitality, Tourism and Recreation (Levels 1 4)

- Interior Design (Levels 1 4)
- Job Interview (Levels 1 4)
- Leadership (Levels 1 4)
- Say Yes to FCS Education (Levels 1 4)

New STAR Events

Red Talks on Education (Online STAR Event) - An individual event recognizing participant(s) who prepare and deliver a TED Talk–style presentation on an education related—topic based on the annual scenario.

Teaching Strategies - An individual event recognizing participant(s) who exhibit knowledge, expertise and competency in incorporating research—based teaching strategies into an original Lesson Plan Activity for any grade level and content area. Participant(s) must prepare a portfolio and a resource container to justify their teaching strategy selections through an in—person role—play where the participant acts as the teacher and the evaluator acts as the student. This event is piloting this year in a select few states (Arizona, Georgia, Indiana, Michigan, Oklahoma) and will be open to all states in 2024-2025.

General Changes

New Look – The guidelines have been re-formatted to a 7 column system. We hope this change makes the guidelines more readable and approachable to both members and advisers.

Dress Code -

- o In order to promote equity and professionalism, the use of costumes is no longer permitted on the National level. Only the FCCLA official dress or chef attire (when applicable) is permitted.
- Dress code has now been added to the Point Summary Form. Points were previously given in the rubrics with body language.

Dates and Deadlines – A central place on the website for all the Competitive Events Dates and Deadlines has been added. The link for this webpage has been added to all events for easy access.

Course Requirements – Removed that specific courses are required to be taken in order to be eligible for a specific event. You will still need to check with your State Adviser to see if there are state-specific policies.

Project Identification Page -

- o Language was added that states "Page can be up to 1 8 ½" x 11" page or 1 slide, but cannot be larger."
- o Participants level is now required to be included.
- Removal of the requirement that the project identification page had to be on plain paper or slide, with no graphics or decorations has been removed.

Point Summary Form – The following point adjustments have been made.

- Registration Packet 1 point (previously 3 points)
- Event Online Orientation 1 point (previously 2 points)

Competing in Multiple Competitive Events

National Fall Conference:

Participants are permitted to compete in one (1) Skill Demonstration Event and up to ten (10) Challenge Tests. Due
to scheduling conflicts, members are not allowed to compete in multiple Skill Demonstration Events OR compete
in a Skill Demonstration Event and FCCLA LifeSmarts Knowledge Bowl.

National Leadership Conference:

During the National Leadership Conference, participants are permitted to take part in one (1) STAR Event OR FCCLA/LifeSmarts Knowledge Bowl in addition, members can compete in one (1) Skill Demonstration Event and up to ten (10) Challenge Test. However, please note that National FCCLA will not accept any schedule requests or accommodations. It is solely the responsibility of the Chapter Adviser and the participant to coordinate and choose a Skill Demonstration Event/Online Challenge Test that occurs on a different day than their STAR Event/Knowledge Bowl.

Event Specific Changes

Baking and Pastry & Culinary Arts -

- FCCLA is excited to introduce Chef Jason Avelson, CCC, CCE, CCA, as the new Culinary Consultant. He comes with a
 wealth of knowledge, experience, and a passion for helping students grow and learn. In his role, Chef Avelson will
 spearhead the creation of recipes, compile equipment lists, provide training to skilled evaluators, and address any
 questions from chapter members and advisers. Any questions regarding Baking and Pastry or Culinary Arts can be
 directed to culinary@fcclainc.org.
- o Removal of the time management plan. Participants are still able to use one, but one is no longer required or will be scored.
- o Points for cleaning up have been added to the rubrics. Additional time to cleanup has also been made.

Culinary Math Management -

Due to low participation numbers, Culinary Math Management will not be offered during the 2023-2024 school year.
 CEAT is working on new ideas to provide members opportunities to showcase their culinary math skills.

Event Management – Time frame has been added as a component on the rubrics.

Fashion Construction -

- A skill selection chart has been added.
- Skills Area Rubric Changes
 - Removed: Sheer Lace or Fabric Overlay, Napped Fabric or One-Way Print, Knit Fabrics .
 - o Added: Elastic/drawstring casing, Matching plaids or striped fabrics, Embroidery-hand/machine.

Fashion Design -

- o Removed the requirement that is needs to be a flat pattern.
- o Added 5 minutes to the oral presentation.
- Rubric Additions/Removal
 - o Added: Pattern Instructions and Collection Sample Photo
 - o Removed: Target Retailer and Pricing

Hospitality and Tourism - Clarification to include both Airbnb's and food trucks as options.

Interior Design -

- Standardized the Planning Guide It is no longer required to use, purchase or meet NBKA Kitchen and Bathroom Planning Guidelines
- o Furniture arrangement is now labeled space planning.

Repurpose and Redesign – Added the option for welding.

Sports Nutrition - Clarified the participant cannot be the student athlete. Previously said "should not".

Skill Demonstration Events/Online Challenge Tests

Online Challenge Tests have been removed from the Skill Demonstration Events Guidelines and now are in their own separate guidelines. Online Challenge Tests will still take place prior to the National Fall Conference (NFC) and receive recognition during NFC.

New Event – Lesson Plan Development and Modifications has been added to the Skill Demonstration Events Guidelines and will take place at the 2023 National Fall Conference in Birmingham Alabama.

Skill Demonstration Events/Online Challenge Tests at NLC – A select few Skill Demonstration Events and Online Challenge Tests will be offered during the 2024 National Leadership Conference. Participants are permitted to take part in both a Skill Demonstration

Event/Online Challenge Test and a STAR Event. However, please note that National FCCLA will not accept any schedule requests or accommodations. It is solely the responsibility of the Chapter Adviser and the participant to coordinate and choose a Skill Demonstration Event/Online Challenge Test that occurs on a different day than their STAR Event.

<u>Please read the 2023 – 2024 event rules carefully to ensure eligibility and receive the highest possible points.</u>

Competitive Events—STAR Events

Students Taking Action with Recognition (STAR) Events are conducted according to the FCCLA National STAR Events Manual found in the National FCCLA website Chapter Portal.

- 1. The District STAR Events Coordinator will submit the STAR Events district results via the DLG to the State STAR Events coordinator within three (3) days of completion of the district competition. The top two (2) finishers in each event/category that meet the minimum score requirement will be eligible to compete at the state leadership conference. After all districts have submitted their results additional at large qualifiers will be notified. All forms, registration, and affiliation will be verified by the Idaho STAR Events Coordinator.
- 2. STAR Events will be held during the State Leadership Conference on Thursday April 11, 2024.
 - Baking & Pastry will be held at the Renaissance Culinary Center: 1307 E. Central Dr. Meridian, ID
 - Culinary Arts will be held at Mountain View High School: 2000 S Millennium Way, Meridian, ID
 - All other competitive events will be held at JUMP in Boise.
 - In case of overflow some events may take place on Friday, April 12th. Affected competitors will be notified prior to SLC.
- 3. Participation at the State level requires STAR Event competitors to do the following:
 - Be an affiliated member by February 1, 2024.
 - Pay a non-refundable \$15 STAR Event registration fee in addition to delegate registration.
 - For Baking & Pastry and Culinary competitor, pay a non-refundable \$15 Food fee in addition to STAR Event registration.
 - Watch the online orientation video prior to State Leadership Conference and submit the proof of completion form to the room consultant at the time of competition. Failure to do so will result in point deduction.
 - Complete the online project summary form in the National FCCLA portal (found under survey applications and competitive events) prior to competition. A copy of the proof of online project summary form submission should be given to the room consultant at the time of competition. Failure to do so will result in point deduction.
 - Be on time for competitions; be courteous to other competitors, judges, and room consultants.
 - The FCCLA official dress code or chef attire (when applicable) are only acceptable.
 - Attend the Friday afternoon Recognition Ceremony and sit by event/category. Must be wearing official dress code and conference name tag to walk across the stage. Baking & Pastry and Culinary competitors are permitted to wear chef attire.
- 4. The top two (2) finishers in each event/category that meet the minimum score requirement will be eligible to compete at National Leadership Conference. The top three (3) finishers in Baking and Pastry and Culinary Arts will be eligible to take the test to compete at National Leadership Conference.
- National Qualifiers must confirm or decline competing at NLC by noon (MST) on April 15, 2024 using the National Qualifier form found in the FCCLA Portal and Idaho FCCLA website.
- 6. **No-Show Fee** of \$10 per competitor will be billed directly to chapter after the conference.

Competitive Events—IDAHO Events

- 1. Any member affiliated by March 1, 2024 is eligible to compete in one (1) STAR Event and one (1) IDAHO Event. See the Idaho FCCLA website for the <u>IDAHO Events Guide</u>.
- 2. Pay a non-refundable \$10 IDAHO Event registration fee in addition to delegate registration.
- 3. No-Show Fee of \$10 per competitor will be billed directly to chapter after the conference.
- 4. Competitors must watch the online orientation video prior to State Leadership conference, and submit the proof of completion form to the room consultant at the time of competition. Failure to do so will result in a point deduction.
- 5. Be on time for competitions; be courteous to other competitors, judges, and room consultants.
- 6. IDAHO Events are not STAR Events and will not advance to the national level.
- 7. Idaho Events will be held on Friday April 12, at JUMP in Boise. In case of overflow some events may take place on Thursday April 11. Affected competitors will be notified prior to SLC.
- 8. Attend the Friday afternoon Recognition Ceremony and sit by event/category. Must be wearing official dress and conference name tag to walk across the stage.

Dress Code

Mandatory Attire for ALL General Sessions

- FCCLA Red Blazer.
- Professional white or black shirt.
- Neckwear options: can include the neckwear from the official emblematic supplier, black or red tie or bow tie, single strand of pearls, red, black, and/or white scarf, or no neckwear.
- Black slacks, skirt, or sheath dress.
- Shoes (black preferred).

*Exception: Culinary Arts and Baking and Pastry Event participants are welcome to wear their Chef's attire during the STAR Events Recognition Session.

Advisers/ Chaperones/ Guests:

- Business professional attire.
- Jeans, t-shirts, or athletic wear are NOT acceptable.

STAR Event and IDAHO Event Participants:

STAR Events participants are expected to adhere to the published dress code. For participation in competition, follow event specifications for dress, and wear appropriate clothing for the nature of the presentation. If attending conference activities prior to or immediately after a presentation, be prepared to change into clothing that meets the conference dress code.

Closing Ceremony Banquet Attendees:

- Semi-formal or business professional attire.
- Jeans, t-shirts, athletic wear, and athletic shoes are NOT acceptable.

Unacceptable Attire:

- Skin-tight, revealing, or midriff-baring clothing.
- Extremely short skirts (shorter than 2 inches above the knee).
- Clothing with suggestive or obscene printing or promotes illegal substances and/or activities.
- Swimwear, rubber beach-type flip flops.
- Nightwear (pajamas) should not be worn outside of your hotel room.
- Leggings are not considered pants.
- Athletic clothing including hats and athletic shoes.
